THE FIRST 100 DAYS

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

As you read this, I will be approaching my first 100 days as the Lead Pastor of Aldersgate UMC. (Actually, October 8th will be my 100th day.)

First, let me thank you for the warm, grace-filled welcome that I have received. The minute that I walked through the doors of this sanctuary, I felt loved and accepted as your lead Pastor.

Here are a few random reflections of my first 100 days:

Staff: We have welcomed two new folks into staff positions: Mrs. Sally Ann Buras, our receptionist. Sally Ann has quickly settled into her role as the face and voice of Aldersgate UMC. She is delightful and resourceful. In fact, it was Sally Ann who procured the 48' trailer for our Flood Relief collection----for free!

Mr. Adam Moore, our Director of Christian Education. Adam particularly relates to Youth, College Aged and Young Adults. (The YaYA, I think it will stick.) That's a big job title, I know. But, we are excited that God sent Adam to us. He certainly has jumped in with both feet and is excited about the possibilities for his ministry here. Adam comes to us with a Masters of Divinity and he is praying about his path through the Ordination process.

Mission: Well, I always say that there's nothing like a natural disaster to bring a church together! Well, actually, I have never said that before...but, this is exactly what I have experienced of Aldersgate UMC! The "Historic Flood of 2016" elicited a tremendous response from this congregation. More than 600 flood buckets (this represents over \$30K worth of product) were provided (items purchased, sorted, organized, buckets filled, and deployed) in four days. Let's add to this: ERT (Early Response Teams) of 5-15 immediately deployed into the job of mucking houses, ongoing gathering and sorting and organizing items for the "Un-Garage" sale, and the ongoing support of Denham Springs UMC's POD (Point of Distribution). Each day since the flooding, you have responded. I know this type of thing gets tiresome but all I see is the energy that keeps it going. Job well done, indeed!

Worship: How exciting is our worship? Well, I may be prejudiced but I think it is very exciting. Thanks to Scott Clausen, a gifted and graced worship planner and leader, we have vital, energetic worship each Sunday at both services. Michele Strain, Phyllis Mitchell, the Chancel Choir and Worship team...and, all of the supplemental musicians are

great gifts to our congregation at well. And, you, you are the ones who don't just respond but full participate in giving God the glory each and every Sunday. For the first 60 days, July and August, our average worship attendance was 310. This is a 16% increase. Thanks be to God. September attendance has dropped that AWA down to 288...still an increase... but..... My prayer is that we continue to grow and be blessed in our worship. It is the central, corporate event of the church.

Finances: While the church's finances are strong, there are still great needs to be met. At present, we are about \$12,000 behind in our income/expenses for the current year. While, comparatively speaking, this is less than many other churches, it is still not financially prudent to operate in a deficit. I am hoping and praying that we have a strong finish in 2016 so that we can start 2017 in the best possible financial position. In addition to our ordinary budget needs, there are extraordinary needs to be met to provide for our ministry needs through our

Debt: Well, we are no longer in debt! In August, we want to the Act of Sale on the property across the street. (See Kathy Stevens' report in this ECHO.) This money is in a designated fund and will not be distributed until the church develops a plan for its purpose.

Vans: The church needs (at least) one new van. The wear and tear on the church vans is a good thing. These vans are always on the GEAUX. Speaking of which, please pray about your support of the upcoming Van GEAUX VIII. What a great, creative fund-raiser. The new van will cost us about \$40K. We already have about 11.5K. So, let's step up and make this the best Van GEAUX ever.

Sound System: This is another area in which the church needs a big upgrade...and, sound stuff isn't cheap! Scott and the Sound Team have met with some folks who are professionals in this area. They are providing quotes for us in this area as well. Ron Davis and Milton Lizana are heading to a conference this month to learn more about creating great Audio and Video worship.

On a personal note, thank you for your care and concern expressed over the death of my Godson, Kurt. Again, thank you for all of the many courtesies you have extended me in the "first 100." I can't wait to see what God does next...

Remember all things happen "By Faith."




A Fellowship for Seniors, 55+ Thursday, October 27 10am in Genesis Hall



From an "Un-Garage" Sale with items filling the John Wesley Center for 3 weeks, and volunteers coming each day to sort, label and pack boxes for delivery.


To a group of Volunteers who came out to Aldersgate one evening and in one hour loaded the "Un-Garage" Sale items into a 48 foot container.


