You see, not only was there a void because of my mother's death, her birthday was Christmas Day...yes, December 25th... her middle name was, "Noel," my most favorite Christmas word...she and Jimmy Buffett...and, Jesus Christ. Wrap your head around that for a moment...

Much of my childhood was spent, pretending about the joy of the season when there was a profound emptiness inside. As an adult, I marvel at my father and all of the other relatives who tried to make something merry that, for me, was profoundly empty and more than a little sad.

Now, if that doesn't flavor your Christmas spirit (and not in a positive way), I don't know what will. The church with her various activities...children's nativity plays, dinners, Chrismons, carols, angels, beautiful evergreens hanging everywhere...the mystery and the pageantry of the season...the scriptures, the Messiah, the communion on Christmas Eve and the ringing of the bells at midnight mass...

You see, even this little heartbroken girl could get that the world was dark and chaotic and in need of healing...and, God had done a marvelous thing and broken into that darkness...a light that could never be extinguished... incarnate, in the flesh to give HOPE, PEACE, LOVE and JOY...to bind up the brokenhearted and to bring salvation from sin...

Happy New Year!...Church new year that is! The beginning of advent is also the first season of the Church liturgical year. It's appropriate that this season of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation begins a year in the life of the church. We are dared to consider the kind of **Hope** the world needs, to **Search** the skies and our hearts for the whisper God stirs in our world, to **Follow** the light of the star to all the places it leads us, to **Believe** that the Good news is still for us, and to **Rejoice** in knowing that God has once again chosen to dwell amongst us. Throughout the advent season, our worship time will follow this progression. We will journey through this time as we prepare our hearts to "receive him still", that on a Silent night, while the world slept, having put its collective hope to bed for the night, God comes and makes a home with us. Whether on a Sunday morning or on Christmas Eve, how will you prepare our house for the stranger, or even, for Jesus? As we prepare our own hearts for the advent of the Christ child, we also need to prepare our house, God's house for the coming of the stranger, the visitor, the guest, for Christ himself. Let us consider what this welcoming might look like in our hearts and our church, and how we may be able to act upon it in the coming weeks...





Something Bigger...

A couple of weeks ago, I preached a sermon about how we get to be a part of "Something Bigger." This was part of our stewardship series.

First, let me thank everyone who made last Sunday, our 40th Celebration Sunday, so successful. It was amazing.

I need you to hear me when I say, "This being a part of something bigger is "God stuff" in the biggest way!"

And, "something bigger" certainly happened last Thursday. As many people were gathering around family tables for Thanksgiving, there was an army of people, from churches of every kind, supported by community businesses, led by dedicated people, providing more than 800 meals for the community. That's "something bigger" than I could ever imagine on an otherwise ordinary Thanksgiving Day.


Jesus says, "Where our hearts are, there our treasures will be also." Jesus cares about what is in our hearts. I love that Jacob Armstrong has made this a key part of this study...the idea that Jesus cares about what is in our hearts.

How is it that we prepare to be a part of this "something bigger" that God invites us into? Well, first of all, we pray. Jesus says that there is a connection between giving to the poor with spending time with God. The author of our Treasure, Jacob Armstrong, states, "If we truly want to be generous givers and experience life more fully, we have to be people of prayer. ***We will never give***

in extravagance and sacrificial ways if we are not abiding with God. We need secret places where God can speak to our hearts. "I like that... We need secret places where God can speak to our hearts.

My hope is that you and your family are using your devotional books and talking about where and what you hope for through our ministry at Aldersgate in the next few years. My hope is that you and your family are dreaming about where and how you can be a part of "something bigger."

There are so many ways that we are part of the "something bigger" of God. It happens through the




variety of ministries in this church: baptism and the Sacrament of Communion; Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, confirmation, and all of the educational ministries of this church; the music and worship ministries of the church; the mission and outreach ministries of this church. 
