

Lent, Three Days and Easter

This has got to be one of the strangest Lenten seasons that I have ever experienced.

I was reading an article by Errol Laborde the other day. Errol Laborde is the editor of the New Orleans magazine. In the article, he was lamenting a similar feeling. He attributed his feeling that "Lent had passed him by." It seems that it is all passing by too quickly: Epiphany and Mardi Gras; March Madness and SEC Baseball and Softball play; a "too early" DST change and not enough cold weather.

As | write this, | have to confess that | am stunned that we have sped through the first three months of this new year....and, Lent.

My favorite part of Lent is Holy Week. Holy Week, the most solemn and intense period of worship in the Christian faith, begins with Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday, the Sunday before Easter. In spite of the spiritual gravity of Holy Week, it begins with joy; for on this Sunday, the Church celebrates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem which foretells the victory of His Resurrection and His return to earth in glory; and with the first reading of the Passion in the liturgies of Holy Week, the Church begins her commemorative pilgrimage with her Lord on His way to Calvary.

The Triduum is the three-day celebration of the death and resurrection of Christ – Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil/Easter

Sunday. The Church meets at times during those three days to remember what it is that Jesus has done for us. Lent often overshadows the Triduum, but in truth, "Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life. Therefore the Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year." (General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, # 18)

Lent exists so that we can prepare ourselves for these three great days. What is remembered during these three days is so spectacular and miraculous that is takes the Church fifty days to celebrate it. From the close of Easter Sunday until Pentecost we celebrate with great joy that which Jesus has done for us.

Regardless of how crazy the rest of the season has been, I am preparing to stop and live Holy Week. This time begins with Palm Sunday and the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem for the Passover. The jubilation quickly turns to darkness as the events of the week unfold in the life of Jesus. The same crowd that cries "Hosanna!" too soon cries, "Crucify Him!" I will, as best as I can, journey and walk with Christ to Calvary...and, I will be so thankful, as we gather for the Sunrise Service and celebrate the Risen Christ.

May it be also true for you.

THE DAY OF CARING WAS AWESOME!



If you have not had a chance to take a walk to the Susanna Wesley building, there have been some new additions. The flower beds near Susana Wesley have been newly landscaped and two garden beds for the Apple Tree Day School have been built, both as a result of the Eagle Scout project done by Chris Barron. His project was meant to beautify the flower beds near Susana Wesley along with providing better site lines for the Apple Tree students and the teachers as they do activities on

the covered outside areas. In addition, Chris built the garden beds to be used by apple tree as they encourage the students to learn about eating and growing fresh vegetables. The project would have been impossible to complete had it not been for the generous donations received from church members and

family and friends along with the manual labor provided by friends, Aldersgate youth and the scouts from troop 348. Many businesses also helped by making donations or giving discounts on the materials used in the project. a fall garden for the students and flowers in the new flower beds. This project will provide a continuous place for out member and visitors to enjoy for years to come. Come check it out!






