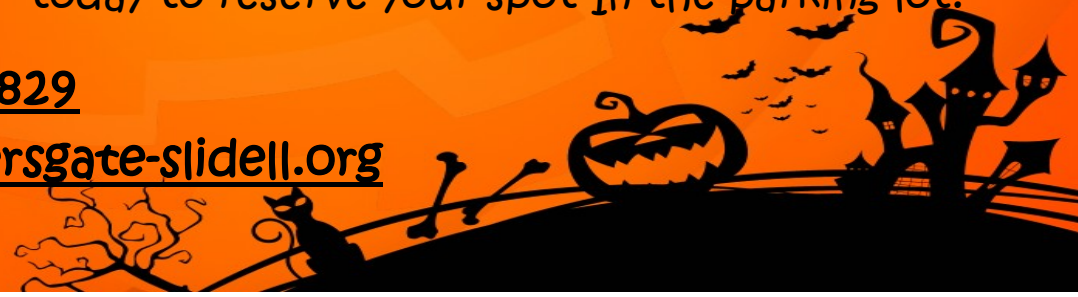

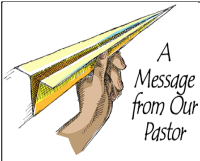

Connection & Cooperation

The roots of the tree touch...

2

Christ is the head of the Body. Our first place of connection and cooperation is with and through Jesus Christ.

Cooperation

Did you know that someone has discovered that when the roots of trees touch, there is a substance present that reduces competition. This unknown fungus helps link roots of various trees, including dissimilar species. A whole forest may be incorporated together in this manner. If one tree has access to nutrients, another to water, and a third to sunlight, the trees have the means to cooperate with one another to live.

In the text, Paul gives us this image of Jesus as the head of the church...the unifying power that keeps the body together. In this role he helps, thinks, guides, and directs the body. If we do not allow him to be the head of life or the church, there will be a great collapse of morals, ethics, and spirit.

Think about this for a minute...this tree illustration is one of many ways to show that we, you and I and others, have a need for cooperation and support for one another...

Our second place of connection and cooperation is in and through the Body, the Church itself.

What is an image of cooperation that sticks out in your mind? What does it mean to you to be connected to something else? A greater cause, perhaps?

Dorotheus of Gaza was a 5th century monk. He once offered this image of the Body of Christ. He said imagine that every Christian in the world was joined by hands as a huge circle surrounding the world... and, then, imagine that in the center is God. As each individual seeks God, moves toward God, then that individual becomes closer and nearer to one another... and, more a part of one another.

So pick an image or illustration...you may have one that is unique to your situation, and really think about what it means to first be connected...and, then once connected to be cooperative toward the mission of the church.

The third place of connection and cooperation is the shared mutual mission and purpose: to love others, serve God and sacrifice for one another.

Paul gives us the ultimate image of "Connection and Cooperation" when he gives us the image of the church as the Body of Christ.

Paul teaches that each Christian has a distinct contribution to give for the benefit of the whole. It comes by way of service to others. Martin Luther said that "a Christian person is the most free of any other, Lord of all, and subject to none; but that person is also the most dutiful servant to all and subject to everybody." Serving others is certainly the Christian's responsibility as Christ demonstrated. Let it be as Robin McGregor has written: "Put a world in my heart, Lord Jesus. Give me lips to tell the Good News."

What is the mission of the church?

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,
because he has anointed me
to bring good news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives
and recovery of sight to the blind,
to let the oppressed go free,
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (Luke
4:18-19)

This connection and cooperation is further work of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus was given the mission. And, he gives the mission for us...to us...And, the mission comes in and through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Let us, always and in all ways, move in a spirit of connection and cooperation to accomplish the mission of the church.

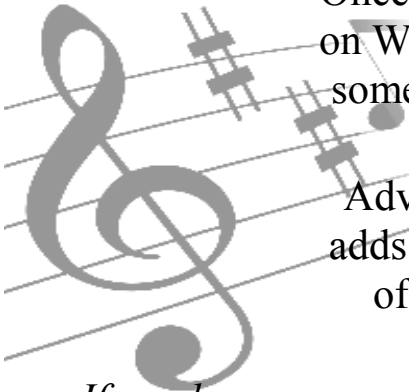
So, let's look at the image that Paul gives us through the image of the tree.

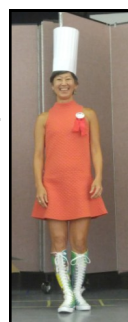

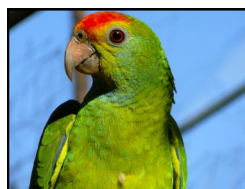


Grown Ups' October guest for "Coffee & Conversation with...." will be Michelle Carollo, Director of Southeast Wildlife and Parrot Rescue.

Stewardship September 2017

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

We have good news for August! If you look at the figures above, you will note that we “made” our month in August. This means that we took in more money than we expended. YaY!

Yes, we are still behind for the year but we have not had to use any of our operating budget reserve cash. YaY!

This is good news on several levels. First, holding the deficit during the summer months is somewhat victorious. The summer is, as a rule, the time when expenses are up and revenue is down. Second, this is good news because if we can maintain the trend of meeting and/or exceeding our expenses for the rest of the year, we will not have too steep a hill to climb for the end of the year giving that we receive in December.

For the coming year, the SPPRC is recommending modest raises for the staff and to bring our Children’s Minister into a full time relationship with the church. If approved by your response to the Stewardship Campaign, this will present an increase of approximately \$8500 and will affect the overall budget by about 1%. I fully support this and pray that you will, too. This is a staff that is fully committed to the mission of this church and tireless in their efforts to bring that mission forward.

As you Pastor, I thank you for your faithfulness and stewardship to the mission and the ministries of this church.
