The church will reimburse you for your "shopping efforts."
- 2. We will be purchasing electric heaters for those who may have little source of heat in their homes. If you know of someone who is need of such a heater, contact the church office (985-641-5829).
- 3. Please make a donation to the "Warmth for the Winter" fund. We will try to meet all needs, as we are able with the resources provided to us. This includes but is not limited to: electric bills, needs of the Food Bank and CCC, for example.
- 4. Be alert for another "sandwich" day...should we see the opportunity.

Here are the words:

Love shall be our token, Love shall be yours and love be mine, Love to God and to all men, Love for plea and gift and sign.

Soren Kierkegaard once told this story:

A prince wanted to find a maiden suitable to be his queen. One day while running an errand in the local village for his father he passed through a poor section. As he glanced out the windows of the carriage, his eyes fell upon a beautiful peasant maiden. During the ensuing days, he often passed by the young lady and soon fell in love. But he had a problem. How would he seek her hand? He could order her to marry him. But even a prince wants his bride to marry him freely and voluntarily and not through coercion. He could put on



this he would never be certain that the maiden loved him or was simply overwhelmed with all of the splendor. The prince came up with another solution. He would give up his kingly robe. He moved, into the village, entering not with a crown but in the garb of a peasant. He lived among the people, shared their interests and concerns, and talked their language. In time the maiden grew to love him for who he was and because he had first loved her.

This is as beautiful an appropriation of the story of the Incarnation of Christ as I have ever heard. Our God coming down to us, to live with us, and to

win us, not by his power, but through HIS great LOVE!

Born that night? PEACE! Born that night? HOPE! Born that night? JOY! Born that night?

LOVE...For God so loved the world that God sent God's Son into the world, not to judge the world but that the world might be saved through Him...

January 25 Grown Ups Coffee & Conversation

ADVENT DEVOTIONAL FROM WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 23, 1992

"Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people." Luke 2:10

The year was 1952, the day was December 24th, the time was one o'clock in the early morning, the place was the western front in South Korea. I had just arrived at the artillery battery that was to be my "home" for the next year. It was cold that morning, very cold, it was noisy, very noisy, and I was scared, very, very scared. I was also tired and as I walked into the bunker I found a veteran G.I. on duty who welcomed me warmly. (Perhaps the main reason for the warm reception was that I was his replacement and he would now be able to go home soon). He looked around and found a half dozen blankets and a cot and told me to get some sleep for I was going to be busy at sunrise." But try as I might, sleep wouldn't come. I was just too cold (even with all those blankets), too scared, and it was just too noisy from the out-going artillery rounds.

As I lay there in the dark, shivering from cold and fear, I realized that the battery operated radio was tuned into the Armed Forces Network and they were bringing messages to the servicemen from the folks back home. I thought how I wished I was home with my family and friends. As I lay there I started to recall all the Christmases past. I thought of Christmas morning, the family dinners and the programs that we had at school and at church. Suddenly I realized that the radio was playing Christmas carols, and as they continued to play the carols I had the warming feeling that God was near, even there in Korea halfway around the world. Then, even though the radio wasn't very loud, they played "Silent Night, Holy Night" and somehow that song was able to drown out the noise that was outside and I fell off to sleep.

The days went by and I was able to adjust to army life and to the conditions in Korea. The truce was signed in July and a quietness came to the land and although the Korean people are still searching for true peace, the truce was a hopeful sign. Then a few days before Christmas 1953, the orders came down that I would be heading 'for home, the departure date - December 26th. Therefore, I would be spending my second Christmas in Korea, but how different it would be from the first one.

On Christmas morning, a group of about 20 orphans came to spend the day at our battery and to share a turkey dinner with us. We passed out gifts (sent to us from families back home), played games and had a most enjoyable day listening to the children's laughter and seeing their smiling faces. After dinner, the children put on a Christmas program, very much like the ones that I was involved in at my church when I was growing up. They closed their program by singing "Silent Night, Holy Night" in their native tongue. The Lord was surely there with all his people throughout the world that day and always.

Prayer: Dear Lord, we thank You for the peace You have given us, which does not depend on feelings or circumstances.

The class is limited to 6 people. To reserve your space, contact the church office at 641-5829.




After the funeral, when the cards and flowers stop coming, most of the people return to their normal lives. But your grief continues and

Stewardship Moment

The End of the Financial Year for 2017

First of all, let me apologize for the lateness of **the Connect.** I have been waiting on End of the Year financials which I (still) do not have as of the printing of this publication. I will send this information out immediately when I receive the corrected numbers for December and the End of the Year.

However, it is clear that we are going to have a significant shortfall for the 2017 Financial year. As of this date, there is a shortfall of pledged income of 5% or \$24,222.15. We generally finish the year with 98% or more in pledged giving. We are projecting a shortfall of about \$60,000.

The church can receive End of the Year giving until January 8th, as long as the contributions are dated

12/31/2017. After this we must close our financial books for the current year. The better we end the year, the stronger we start the new year. Also, end of the year gifts to the church are certainly beneficial to tax deductions.

2018 Stewardship Report (as of 12/31/2017)

Thus far, we have received 98 pledges for the coming year totaling \$420,229.00. Our projected budget for the coming year is \$770,000.00. This represents only 55% of the income that we need to operate the church in the coming year.

The Finance Committee and the Administrative Council will meet in January to look at the adoption of this budget. Factors which will be looked at concerning the proposed adoption of this budget are Pledged Giving, Unpledged Giving (based upon historical trends), Sunday School offering, Loose Plate Offering and other (small) miscellaneous sources of income. The number one factor is Pledged Giving. This is why it is sooooo very important to have your financial commitments for the coming year. In 2017, there were 127 pledges totaling \$484,443.00. So we are missing a significant number of pledges for the coming year.

Can you imagine how hard it would be for you to run your households or businesses without a true picture of your expected income? I can tell from the standpoint of the church and the leadership of the church this is extremely "challenging."



I would certainly be remiss if I didn't thank you for your faithfulness and generosity throughout the year. Amazing things have happened this year through the ministry of the church. Next month, I hope to report more fully on how we achieved Something Bigger at Aldersgate UMC.

On behalf of the staff, thank you for your generous gifts that provided for year-end Christmas bonuses for the staff. All were so very appreciative.

Me? I am thankful for a staff that rises to every challenge with which they are confronted.

I am thankful to a congregation that always allows themselves to be nudged...okay, pushed to do even more than they can imagine.

I am thankful to be your Pastor and I look forward to our future together as we welcome another year of shared ministry.
