L'Chaim is a Hebrew expression that means "To Life."

This Easter season is about life...new life...

As I sit writing this, I am observing new life almost everywhere I look... mommas feeding baby birds in my back yard ...young squirrels just learning to steal and run... the proliferation of the (dreaded) ligustrum in full bloom and the re-blooming hydrangea...all signs of life... new life...

Last Sunday (April 15), I called on you to share your stories and be witnesses for Jesus Christ.

So, here is my witness of the "new life" (in no particular order) that I see at Aldersgate United Methodist Church:

The Men's Ministry as a renewed, active, vibrant part of the church... More than 20 at breakfast on the first Saturdays of the month...After breakfast, the men came back to the church and do "fix it" projects on behalf of the Board of Trustees... plus they are engaged in a very important mission project in the St Tammany Community...Building a outside kitchen for the Giving Hope Retreat....Can I say it? They are "cooking up a storm" in every sense of the word... Palm Sunday, Pork Butt and Chicken Sunday, AppleTree 40th & Mother's Day...fully engaging in mission work at the church and the community...

A renewed vision for the Women's Ministry of the church...One day, as we tell this story, we will preface it with "it all began when we took that cruise..." Thus far, there were sixteen women on retreat in April at the Beckwith Center, working on a new social media page...and, the May 19th Tea featuring Sally Ann Roberts and her sister, Dorothy: Sold Out... 192 tickets sold...when was the last time that we said the words "Sold Out?"

One of the core values of Aldersgate UMC is a heart for mission. Epworth, Sager-Brown, Christian Community Concern, Family Promise, The Blood Bank of GNO... children in mission, youth in mission, adults in mission and senior adults in mission...the various Bible Studies, Small Groups, Adult groups...all seeking a way to serve others and "share the life." This month, Suzie Hunt will take a group to Sager Brown for a quick retreat/work week. And, we are looking at a mission to St. Thomas in October. Last Sunday Appletree Preschool celebrated their 40th year of "tending" the "little lambs" of Slidell. What a great celebration it was! More than 300 in our morning worship service. And, yes, "Kindergarten Here They Come." Appletree Preschool continues to be a beacon of light in this church and in our community.

One recent Sunday, in the 11:00 AM service (April 15th), there were 107 in attendance. 31 of them were children... 30% of the congregation were children...now that is a great sign of growth and "new life." The Children's Ministry has had a full year with opportunities nearly every week. And, the growth of the Children's Ministry means that their parents are becoming more and more committed and involved.

A more than full church calendar EVERY month... Every month it is remarked in the staff meeting, "Well, (pick a month) is getting pretty full."

On May 6th, we will recognize our Graduating Seniors and our Youth Ministry Ministries. Again, weekly challenges in Sunday School, Small Group, Large Group, Thursday mornings at Starbuck. There are two challenging and creative mission trips for the youth this summer. The Junior Highs (and many from that large Confirmation Class) will be headed to Alabama. The Senior Highs will he headed to do hurricane recovery work in Key West. What? I want to go on that trip!

Have you heard about some of our college kids (our former youth) who are making their way in the world through lives of service: Adrianna Iennusa (the Miss Louisiana Pageant), Regan Horn (The World Race), Terri Jackson (Nicaragua), Jacob Lovitt (FEMA Corps)? If I have left anyone out, please let me know. I am so proud of these...and, where did their love of mission start? Right here at Aldersgate.

There will be 17 confirmed in the services on Pentecost. Now, this may not be the largest confirmation class ever but it is the largest that we have seen in a long time...

Speaking of the children's ministry, their calendar continues to be full. The Camp Summer Sonshine will be expanded this year to a 7 week, 3 day program with plans for it to be 7 weeks, 5 days next year. Did I mention Vacation Bible School, Sunday School, Faith Friends, Camp Istrouma, etc? Talk about a full calendar!

The Trustees is another group that is on fire. The Trustees have evaluated the buildings on the campus. They have identified projects in different categories from "ordinary maintenance" to "we have a problem." Some are wants…others are needs. The

good news: many are manageable projects that can be taken on by individuals or groups. The Men's group for example is punctuating their monthly breakfast with a work day at the church, rain or shine. On the other hand, some are projects that need some particular

licensing or expertise that we will have to pay for. So, look for an upcoming list of projects, prioritized by the Trustees, that may need additional funding.

Earlier this month, we received generous monetary gifts that will fully fund two significant projects for our church: the re-voicing of our bells and a new state of the art

sound system for our sanctuary. From time to time the bells need to be "sent away" to be "re-voiced." This is an important maintenance issue for the bells. The approximate cost for this is \$6,000. On a similar note (did you see what I did there?), our sound technicians have been patching our system together with paper clips, duct tape and bubble gum... while, that may be a bit of an exaggeration...our system is almost 20 years old. The sound folks came back with a bid of \$28,000 to completely replace the necessary components. This system is specifically designed to improve the "spoken voice" quality for our sanctuary. Interestingly enough, the new system will cost less than the present system cost 19 years ago. Both of these systems have been fully funded by private donations. God is good!

TO LIFE!

Throughout the church there is a spirit of renewal, growth and the laity taking on the ownership of our ministry and calling in the church, the community and the world. I will not name all of the groups because surely I will leave some out. When I

I am sincere when I say they work tirelessly, each one of them, to fulfill the calling that has been placed on their hearts as the staff of Aldersgate United Methodist


Church. We are thankful for the addition of Jon Nelson to our staff, as our financial secretary. We have also hired Adam Trouard as the Minister of Music and Worship.

Help Aldersgate UMC Meet its 2018 Blood Donation Goal!

You don't have to wait for a blood drive at the church to help Aldersgate to meet it's 2018 Blood Donation Goal. Members of our congregation can help their church community qualify for the Blood Assurance-Cost Reimbursement Program when they donate at The Blood Center's main office as well.



As a congregation, we need 75 donations per year to continue in this valuable program that makes all members of Aldersgate, people who have donated blood and non-donors, eligible for up to \$2,500 to help recover the cost of the blood products received due to surgery or illness.

When you donate at The Blood Center, please tell them to credit your donation to the Aldersgate UMC code **C870**. If you can't remember the code, they can look it up.

If you are a member of Aldersgate and have had a blood transfusion this year, contact the church office for the program's paperwork.

When we give as a church, not only do we help take care of others here and in our community, we help our fellow church members in their time of need.


